WELCOME NEW MEMBERS

We're happy to have you with us. The St. Andrew Bay Quilters' Guild, Inc. (SABQG) was founded in 1978 to promote interest in quilts and quilting. We have over 200 members ranging from professionals who teach quilting or sell their work, to those who don't quilt at all (we call them our "appreciators"). No matter where you fall in this range, you are sure to find inspiration and encouragement in associating with your fellow guild members.

Here's what you get with your membership:

First Wednesday and First Thursday – Sit n' Stitch is held in a member's home or our Quilt Room each month on the first Wednesday (daytime) and first Thursday (evening). Bring your current project to work on, or just come to see what everyone else is doing. Refreshments provided. (see your newsletters for time and place, no RSVP required).

General membership meeting – A general membership meeting is held the third Wednesday (daytime) and Thursday (evening) at St. Andrews Episcopal Church. Each meeting includes an instructional demonstration, an opportunity for members to "show and tell", a short business meeting, and refreshments.

Fourth Wednesday – On the fourth Wednesday (daytime) we have a workday where members gather to work on community service or guild projects.

Other benefits – Membership includes free use of the guild's library, eleven issues of our newsletter, Patchwords, a membership pin, a membership card, a birthday gift, weekend retreats and other special events throughout the year, the opportunity to work with others on guild projects and committees, and – best of all – the camaraderie of a fun bunch of fellow quilt lovers. You can visit our website at sabqg.org and you also can submit pictures or related items to our webmaster for inclusion on our site. It is a great way to show friends and family what you are up to.

Your responsibilities to SABQG:

All members are required to purchase or sell tickets for our Opportunity Quilt. Members also work during the annual quilt show and in doing so are given free admission to the show.

All members are required to assist at least once a year as a hostess at a general meeting or sign up to hostess or assist with "Sit n' Stitch" at a member's home or some other appropriate place.

Members wear a nametag at each general meeting. We allow you two months after joining to complete your name tag; after that, we collect a 25 cent fine in exchange for a general nametag at the sign-in desk.

Members are encouraged to make a vest, which incorporates the guild logo – a circle of red hearts on a white background – in its' design. There are no other required elements and individual creativity is applauded.
