## QUILT SHOW PREVIEW

You haven't received any words on the Quilt Show in awhile, but it's time to start thinking about it, as Jo-Ellen and I are getting busy too. All the information regarding the Quilt Show Contest will be in this newsletter and will be available on our website. Please print out this information so you have it. Now is the time to be making plans on what quilts you want to make and or already have for the show. You have lots of time to get ready.

At the request of the membership we are adding a new category entitled ART/INNOVATIVE. Any quilt entered into this category must be an original piece of work. No commercial pattern may be used. Many of you took the Thread Painting class offered by Mary Zahner. We're hoping some of you were inspired and will show us your work. Remember, you can't use Mary's pattern for the contest – that can be your practice piece. We look forward to seeing what you will present to us.

For the first time this year, we are trying to see if members are interested in offering the quilts they exhibit for sale. We have a form attached after the Registration Form for you to send to Beverly. This information will be attached to the quilt. The sale of the quilt will be between the seller and buyer. The Guild will not be part of the sale.

One BIG CHANGE that you need to catch is the the Registration Form for entries into the show need to be to Beverly by DECEMBER 15, 2016. This will give us more time to get our show program together. We're going to keep reminding you of this. Your quilt doesn't need to be finished until February!

Lastly, this is the time of year when we are looking for chairmen for the different committees. Think in your heart of your way of contributing and sign up the chair one of these committees. See Beverly.

## St. Andrew Bay Quilters' Guild Guidelines

### "Quilts From The Heart" Quilt Show 2017

This annual Quilt Show showcases quilts made by members of the St. Andrew Bay Quilters' Guild. Only active members of the Guild may enter quilts into the competition. To be an active member, one needs to have paid dues by July 1, 2016 and participated in Guild activities. This show is a judged competition, judged by a certified judge. Quilts by nonmembers may be displayed as space allows.

Quilters should enter one quilt per category. If more than one quilt is entered in a category and meets the category requirements, only one quilt will be judged. The other will be for display. All quilts entered into the competition must have been completed in 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017. **THE QUILT SHOW COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO MOVE A QUILT FROM ONE CATEGORY TO ANOTHER IF THE COMMITTEE FEELS THAT THE NEW CATEGORY IS MORE APPROPRIATE.** No tied quilts can be entered into the show. To utilize a panel in a quilt, the panel must be cut apart and repurposed. A "stand alone" panel, embellished or not, will not be judged, but will be displayed.

The THEME/CHALLENGE category for the 2017 show is entitled "STAR GAZING". Quilts in this category must contain stars, either pieced or appliqued and it must be wall size. Once again we would like to recognize members who have never entered a quilt into a show. This category is entitled First Time Entry. These quilts will not be judged, but will receive a participation ribbon.

Each judged category will be eligible for a First, Second or Third place ribbon, as well as, Honorable Mention. Additional ribbons will be awarded for Hand Quilting Excellence, Machine Quilting Excellence, Judge's Choice and Viewer's Choice. The Best of Show ribbon is selected from the First Place winners in each category. The Viewer's Choice ribbon is presented based on the votes of the show attendees.

All entries must have a 4" sleeve casing attached to the back of the quilt. All large quilts must have a slit or opening in the middle of the sleeve so an additional support hook can be attached. A secured label must be on the back of the quilt with the quiltmaker's name. **DO NOT USE PAPER LABELS.** The label must be loosely covered with a piece of muslin to cover the entrant's name during judging. This label cover will be removed after judging. It can be attached with safety pins, but **NO STRAIGHT PINS ARE ALLOWED.** Each quilt submitted to the Quilt Committee must be contained in its own fabric bag (no plastic, please) with the quiltmaker's name on the bag also.

Quilts are to be delivered to the Quilt Show Committee on February 7, 2017 at St. Andrew Episcopal Church between 9:00 am and 12:00 Noon. Alternate arrangements need to be made to Beverly Pierzchala at (850) 271-8913.

Quilts are to be picked up after 5:00 pm on Saturday, February 11, 2017 at the Holley Center/FSU Panama City.

**EACH QUILT ENTERED INTO THE CONTEST MUST HAVE A REGISTRATION FORM.**

The form is due to Beverly Pierzchala by December 15, 2016.

**\*\*\*\*A QUILT HAS A TOP, MIDDLE (BATTING) AND A BACKING SEWN (QUILTED) TOGETHER.**

## QUILT SHOW 2017 CONTEST CATEGORIES

1. **BED SIZE QUILTS** A quilt intended for use on a bed. Width 63" or more. Length 80" or more
  - 1.1 Quilt Made by One Person. Any technique. May be hand or machine quilted
  - 1.2 Quilt Made by Two Persons. Any technique. May be hand or machine quilted
2. **GROUP QUILT**  
Any quilt which three or more people work on the construction or finishing in any way.
3. **WALL SIZE QUILT**
  - 3.1 **SMALL WALL QUILT/PIECED** Dimensions no larger than 160" total. May be hand or machine quilted
  - 3.2 **SMALL WALL QUILT/APPLIQUED** Dimensions no larger than 160" total. At least 75% of quilt must have applique. May be hand or machine quilted
  - 3.3 **LARGE WALL QUILT/PIECED** Dimensions larger than 160"/side larger than 40" but no larger than 80". May be hand or machine quilted.
  - 3.4 **LARGE WALL QUILT/APPLIQUED** Dimensions larger than 160"/side larger than 40". At least 75% of quilt must have applique. May be hand or machine quilted.
4. **THEME/CHALLENGE "STAR GAZING"**  
A quilt in this category must contain stars. Any type of stars acceptable. The completed quilt must be no larger than a large wall quilt. It may be hand or machine quilted.
5. **ART/INNOVATIVE**  
An original work of art, made for display on a wall; no bedsize allowed. No published pattern may be used. Quilt may be made using any technique with fabrics the primary medium. May be hand or machine quilted. It should contain a finished edge.
6. **MINIATURE**  
Any technique may be used (pieced or appliqued). This category is not determined by size alone; it must be a small version of a full sized quilt. The maximum block size is 4". It should measure less than 24" per side.
7. **FIRST TIME ENTRY**  
The quilt entered into this category must be the first quilt the quilt maker has ever entered into a show. The quilt can be any size and made with any technique.
8. **OTHER**  
This category includes quilts which do not use three layers of fabric or are not quilted, as in a Grandmother's Flower Garden, Cathedral Window or Crazy Quilt. Whole Cloth quilts are included in this category. Wool work w/o batting may be included. Wool work should be a total wool project, excluding binding and backing. Quilts, as in Summer Quilts, without batting will not be judged.

Block of the Month program for charity quilt projects. All blocks are 12". A quilt can be one block, a combination of blocks, or a sampler. Three blocks will be given each month for five months to complete a sampler Warrior Beach Retreat quilt.

**General Instructions**

**Warrior Beach Retreat:**

Size: 72" x 44"

**Sashing and cornerstones:**

Blue – 1 yard; cut 38 rectangles 12 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Cream – 1/4 yard; cut 25 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

**Child size Quilt**

Size: 46" x 32"

**Sashing, border, and cornerstones:**

Blue – 5/8 yard;

Sashing – cut 7 rectangles 12 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Border – cut 10 rectangles 12 1/2" x 3 1/2"

Purple – 1/8 yard;

Inner blocks – cut 2 squares 2 1/2" x 2 1/2"

Outer blocks – cut 4 squares 3 1/2" x 3 1/2" and 6 rectangles 3 1/2" x 2 1/2"

**Half Square Triangle:**

Add 7/8" to finished size:

Finished Size	Cut squares	Unfinished Size
3"	3 7/8"	3 1/2"
4"	4 7/8"	4 1/2"
6"	6 7/8"	6 1/2"

**Hourglass:**

Add 1 1/4" to finished size:

Finished Size	Cut squares	Unfinished Size
3"	4 1/4"	3 1/2"
4"	5 1/4"	4 1/2"
6"	7 1/4"	6 1/2"

**NOTE:** I like to add an extra 1/4" to 3/8" to the cut size to allow for any human error.

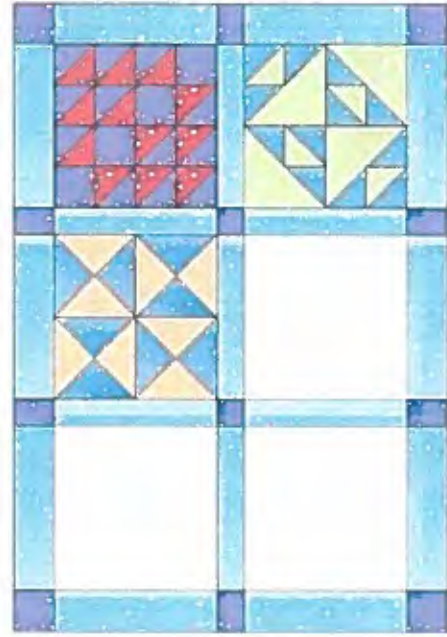
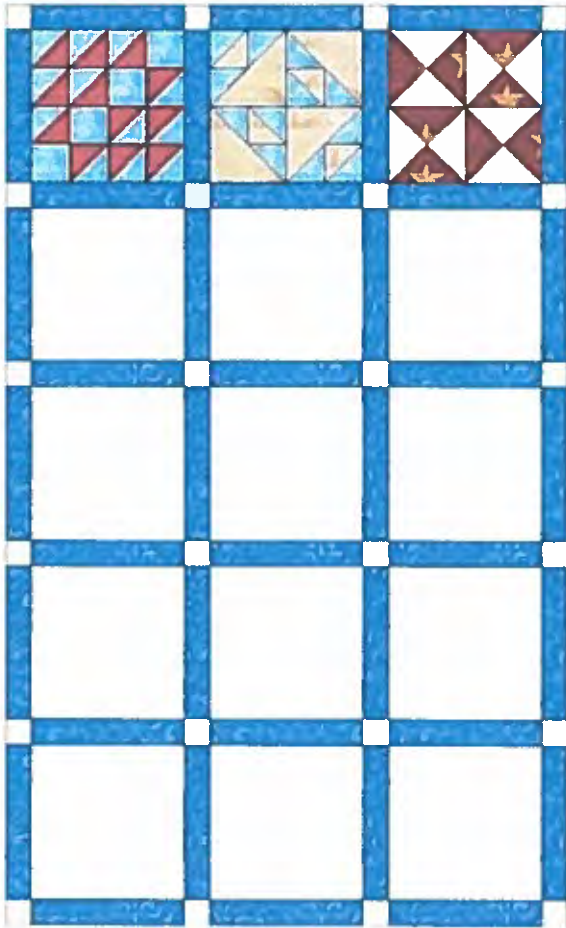

Red: Cut 6 squares  $3\frac{7}{8}'' \times 3\frac{7}{8}''$

Blue: Cut 6 squares  $3\frac{7}{8}'' \times 3\frac{7}{8}''$

**Block Two: Dutch Puzzle**

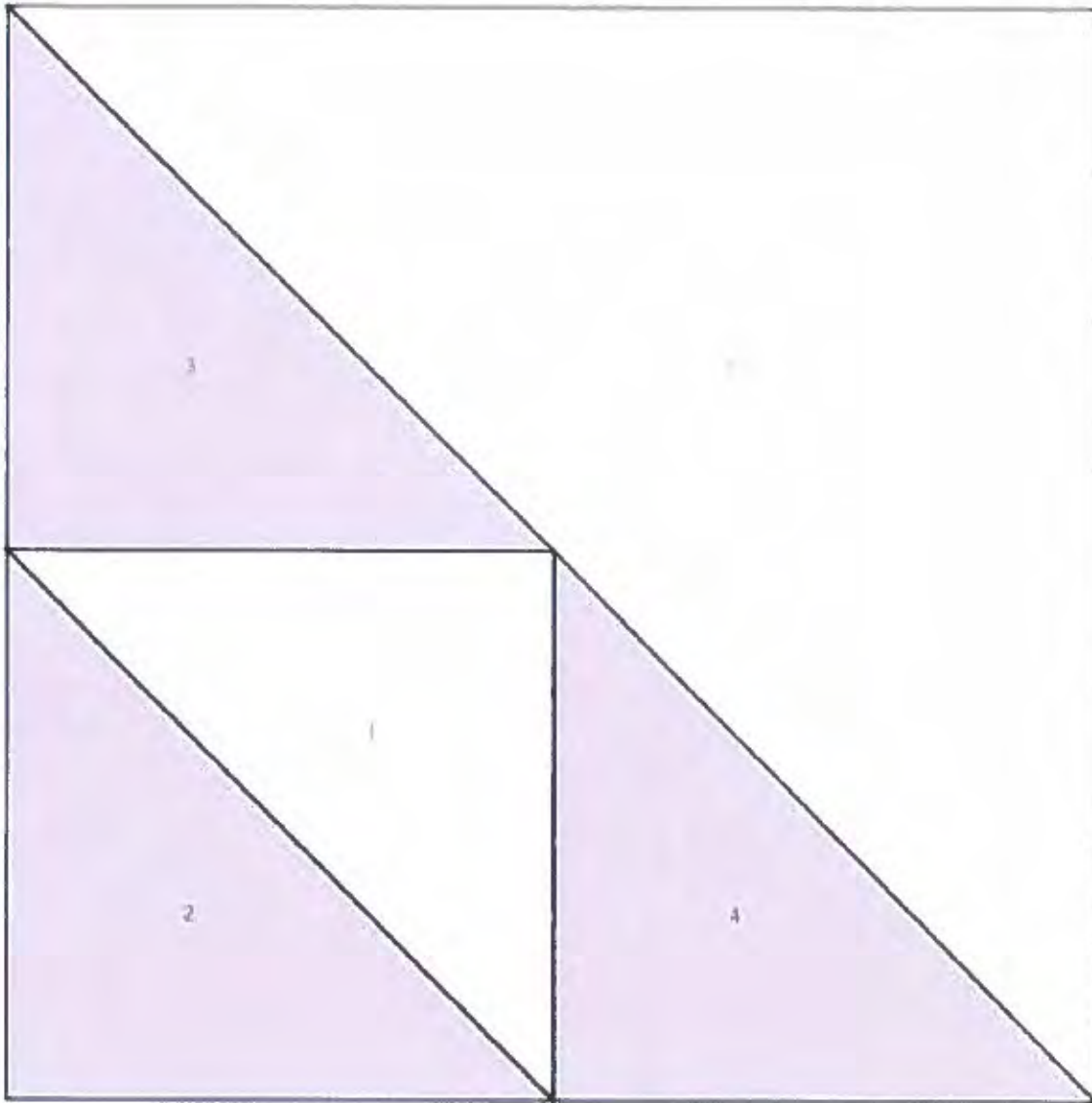
Make 4 blocks using the attached paper piece.

**Block Three: Little Hourglass**

Red: Cut 2 squares  $7\frac{1}{4}'' \times 7\frac{1}{4}''$

Cream: Cut 2 squares  $7\frac{1}{4}'' \times 7\frac{1}{4}''$

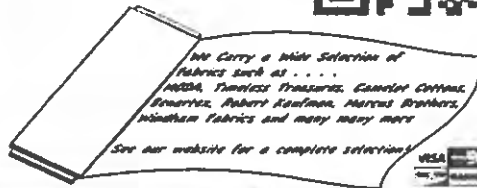
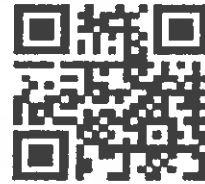

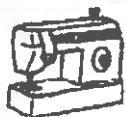
