The Snippets technique means to freely cut pieces of fabric to create a picture. The snippets can be small or large. They can be precise or free form. A fusible web is first applied to the back of the fabric pieces so once the picture is finished, it can be permanently fused into place. This technique can be successful by people at every skill level.

This book includes explaining the process, how to get started, and several examples to try.

ST. ANDREW BAY QUILTERS' GUILD
QUILT SHOW "QUILTS FROM THE HEART" 2020

This annual Quilt Show showcases quilts made by members of the St. Andrew Bay Quilters' Guild. Only active members, having paid their yearly dues as of September 1, 2019 and participated in Guild activities, are eligible to participate in the show. The Quilt Show is a judged competition. Quilts made by nonmembers may be displayed as space allows.

Quilters may enter one quilt per category. If more than one quilt is entered in a category, only one will be judged. The other will be for display. All quilts entered must have been completed in the years 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2020. THE QUILT SHOW COMMITTEE RESERVES THE RIGHT TO MOVE A QUILT FROM ONE CATEGORY TO ANOTHER IF THE COMMITTEE FEELS THAT THE NEW CATEGORY IS MORE APPROPRIATE. No tied quilts will be judged. A panel may be allowed as long as it is divided into pieces or sections and is part of a larger quilt.

The Theme/Challenge category for 2020 is "A Salute To Our Military". Quilts in this category should reflect a military theme. Directions for the theme quilt is on the Categories page. The show will again have a category named First Time Entry. Members who have never entered a quilt into our show are eligible to enter First Time Entry. This quilt will be critiqued by our judge but will not be eligible for a ribbon. They will receive a special First Entry ribbon. There is a new category for 2020 entitled "Bobbi's Handwork". A quilt entered in this category should feature handwork, such as hand embroidery. The project entered must be a quilt (have three layers-top, batting, back) and should be wall size. The first place winner will receive The Bobbi Award.

Each judged category will be eligible for a First, Second, Third place ribbon as well as Honorable Mention. Additional ribbons are available for Hand Quilting Excellence, Machine Quilting Excellence, Judge's Choice and Best of Show. These special awards are given to Guild members only. For Best of Show winner and Bedsize/Two Person a ribbon will be awarded to the quilt entrant and to the machine quilter (if applicable). A Viewer's Choice award will be presented based on the votes of the show attendees.

All entries must have a 4" sleeve casing attached to the top back of the quilt. All large quilts must have a slit or opening in the middle so an extra support hook can be attached. A secured label must be on the back of the quilt listing the quilt maker's name. DO NOT USE PAPER LABELS. The label must be loosely covered with a piece of muslin. It can be attached with safety pins, but NO STRAIGHT PINS ARE ALLOWED. Each quilt submitted to the Show Committee must be contained in its own fabric bag (no plastic please) with the quiltmaker's name on the bag as well.

Quilts are to be delivered to the Quilt Show Committee on February 11, 2019 at Grace Presbyterian Church, 1415 Airport Rd, (corner of Airport Rd and Lisenby), Panama City between 9:00 – 12:00 Noon. Alternate arrangements need to be made to Beverly Pierzchala at (850)571-3160 or (850)896-9510.

Quilts are to be picked up after 5:00 p.m. on Saturday, February 15, 2020 at the Holley Center, Florida State University/Panama City.

EACH QUILT ENTERED INTO THE CONTEST MUST HAVE A REGISTRATION FORM. Forms are available on the Guild website, SABQG.org or from Beverly Pierzchala.

This form is due to Beverly Pierzchala by December 15, 2019.

*****A QUILT HAS A TOP, MIDDLE (BATTING), AND A BACKING SEWN (QUILTED) TOGETHER.

QUILT SHOW 2020 CONTEST CATEGORIES

BED SIZE QUILT A quilt intended to cover a bed. Width 63" or more, Length 80" or more

1. **QUILT MADE BY ONE PERSON** Any piecing technique. May be hand or machine quilted
2. **QUILT MADE BY TWO PERSONS** Any piecing technique. May be hand or machine quilted

GROUP QUILT

3. **GROUP QUILT** Any quilt which three or more persons work on the construction or finishing in any way

WALL SIZE QUILT

4. **APPLIQUE WALL QUILT** Any size. Applique must be the dominant feature of the quilt. The quilt may be hand or machine appliqued. May be hand or machine quilted
5. **SMALL WALL QUILT/PIECED** Dimensions no larger than 160" total. May be hand or machine quilted
6. **LARGE WALL QUILT/PIECED/ONE PERSON** Dimensions larger than 160" in total, with the length no longer than 80". The quilt may be hand or machine quilted **BUT MUST BE COMPLETED BY ONE PERSON.**
7. **LARGE WALL QUILT/PIECED/TWO PERSONS** Dimensions larger than 160" total, with the length no longer than 80". The quilt may be hand or machine quilted **BUT COMPLETED BY TWO PERSONS**

THEME/CHALLENGE "A Salute to Our Military"

8. **THEME** Quilt should be patriotic in theme and honor the United States. Any design or pattern may be used, but cannot be a panel. It may be hand or machine quilted. The quilt should be no larger than a large wall quilt.

ART/INNOVATIVE QUILT

I. **ART QUILT** The quilt should be an original work of art, made for display on a wall. No published pattern may be used. Quilt may be made using any technique with fabrics the primary medium. May be hand or machine quilted. It should contain a finished edge.

MINIATURE

J. **MINIATURE QUILT** Any technique may be used (pieced or applique). The miniature is not determined by size alone; it must be a small scale version of a full size quilt. The maximum block size is 4". It should measure less than 24" per side. It must be completed by one person.

BOBBI'S HANDWORK

K. **HANDWORK QUILT** Handwork/embroidery must be the main feature of the quilt. It may be hand or machine pieced as well as hand or machine quilted.

FIRST ENTRY

I. **FIRST ENTRY** This quilt is the first one entered into the Guild Quilt Show. Any technique is allowed. May be hand or machine quilted

OTHER

M. **OTHER QUILT** Any project which does not contain three layers, as in Grandmother's Flower Garden. Wool work which does not contain batting or three layers may be in this category.
