## Food Drive for Catholic Charities


We will be collecting packaged, non perishable food products at the meetings. We will also be doing this again in November.

As we enter the month of October, this saying says it best: " If a year was tucked inside of a clock, then autumn would be the magic hours."



Remember the deadline for the registration forms is


