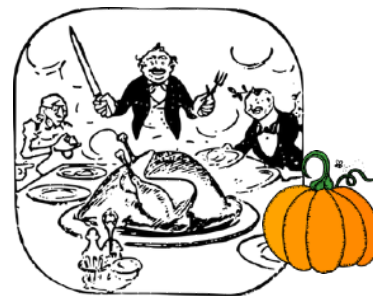

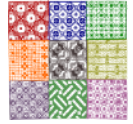

The deadline for the January Patchwork issue will be sometime mid to late December. **Quilt Show:** Jo-Ellen Rogers & Beverly Pierzchala – The quilt show will be February 11 & 12, 2022. All forms and entry information can be found on our webpage, www.SABQG.org Our goal is to have over 100 quilts in the show. Lots of volunteers are needed and Carolyn Finlayson is taking on the job of Volunteer Coordinator for the quilt show. Next month we will have the opportunity to sign up for various jobs, to help out at the Guild Quilt Show. Carol Shultz is our “Turn-In Day” Coordinator. Lauri Dasinger is helping out on that project and brought in a sign-up sheet for helpers during that day. Karen Radcliff will coordinate the Show Program. And it is up to all of the guild members to try and sell advertising for the Show Program. There will be a monetary prize for the 1st and 2nd place members who have sold the most money in advertising. Karen also has a letter and form to be handed out to businesses. Advertisements run from \$25 to \$250. Vendor spots are all full. We have one vendor on the wait list. Note: Make sure, when submitting your form for your quilt entry, that you read all the category information. And that you submit your quilt in the correct category.

Program: Barbara Tillman – There will be no programs in November or December because of our holiday luncheons. Today’s program was hosted by Barbara Tillman. Barbara gave a talk on how to identify the age of your quilt. Many members of the guild brought their vintage and antique quilts to be viewed by all in attendance.
