Hello Fellow Quilters,



We have 102 quilts entered into the show. The judge is set. Carol Schulz is in heading up Turn-in-Day activity. For those of you who have entered quilts, you need to have your quilt at the church (Grace Presbyterian Church) Tuesday, February 8th, from 9:00 am – 12:00 pm. Of course, make sure your quilts are clean and smell good. And that they are in good shape. To ensure a safe return of your quilt(s), you will receive a receipt when you drop off your quilt. You **must** have that receipt to get your quilt back after the show. Your quilt must

have: 1) Label that is covered. Safety Pins or tape. But no straight pins. 2) Each quilt dropped off in its own bag, which is labeled with members name and the name of the quilt. 3) Make sure you have a "sleeve" for the top of your quilt, about 4" wide. If your quilt is 70" or more, make sure that your sleeve has a slit in the middle of the sleeve. 4) If you are not able to drop off your quilt at turn-in-day, please contact Beverly Pierzchala. 5) Quilts will be held in a lock room. 6) **Final**

Inspection - After picking up your quilt, by turning in your Ticket stub which you received on Turn-in-Day, it is up to you to make sure your quilt is the one inside the bag. Carolyn Finlayson is heading up the Quilt Show volunteer shifts. Contact Carolyn if you wish to volunteer to work any part of the two days of the showCarolyn Pic has the signup sheet for the observation of the judging of the quilts.
