I know you're on pins and needles(sorry for the pun) Will our questions be answered?


- -Will Sarah find the lost strips?

Now, how to figure where to sew these into the strip.

After looking at where they were in the "strip set" colored



After using them I still needed more (sigh). I only needed to cut a few more strips. It looked like I was going to have about 18 inches left of the strip set. So I started at the bottom and un-sewed enough to finish. (Sigh again) I just had the two borders left to sew on and I was finished with the top.

Library Corner


Hello, members.
