The meeting was called to order at 7 pm by 2nd Vice President Carolyn Finlayson. There were 29 members and one new member present. Information from the Day meeting was shared including the report from our very successful Quilt Show. The members were informed of the new theme category Home Sweet Home along with the two additional categories Other and Handwork. The slate of officers was presented, there were no nominations from the floor. Janet Bell announced we will be making pillowcases for Anchorage Children's Home and we will continue with our other projects that are ongoing. Carolyn Pic informed members of the date, location, and cost of the Fall Retreat to be held the first weekend in November. She also announced the opening for a newsletter editor. The Annual General Meeting will be held Sat., May 21, 10:30 to 1:00 PM. Sign up sheets were passed for members who plan to attend. There is no cost to the members. The theme will be Happy New Quilting Year. A very informative program on Art Quilts was given by Diane Holman. Diane brought many examples of her quilts. She began her discussion telling us how she started making Art Quilts and followed with many examples, explaining the process used for each quilt. She discussed her fabrics of choice, how she approaches color and the tools she uses to make the quilts. She has furthered her study of Art Quits taking workshops from renowned quilter Nancy Crow. This program was very informative and enjoyed by all in attendance.

QUILT SHOW FUTURE PLANS

Your quilt show team has been working on plans for our next show/contest! The contest categories have some changes. We hope that they will interest you. We are once again going to have a Handwork category. Quilts in this category have to primarily feature hand embroidery, with or without embellishment. The quilt must be wall size, with no side larger than 80 inches. It can be hand or machine quilted. The first place in this category will win The Bobbi Award.

Our theme/challenge category is entitled "Home Sweet Home." Quilts in this category should feature a home or homes (houses) as the main feature. All kinds of houses can be featured, not only people houses but other houses, such as bird houses or dog houses! Creativity in house designs is encouraged. The quilt should be wall size, with no side being larger than 80 inches. Any technique may be used. It may be hand or machine quilted.

We hope that we have piqued your interest. A full packet of guidelines, rules and categories will be available in June.

So warm up your needles and get a head start.
