Call Marie if you need more information. Meeting Program: Sarah Hutton talked about and displayed many Stain Glass Quilts. She explained the two types of Stain Glass Quilts. One type of Stain Glass Quilts are the ones with bias tape placed around each colored pieces of fabric to create the stain glass leaded look. The second type of Stain Glass Quilts, and the one that Sarah likes the best, is with your black fabric as your foundation. And using a light box, applique your color "glass" fabric onto the black fabric. Sarah will be teaching a 2part class on this technique, starting next Thursday, April 28. Followed by part 2 on Thursday, May 5th. Contact Sarah for information on registration of this class. The number of attendees is limited. You will have a choice of 4 designs to pick from, Sunflower, Poppy, Forget-Me-Nots, or Iris. **Unfinished Business:** Karen Radcliff - Last month Karen read, to the members, the nomination committee's recommendations for the new board for 2022-2023. 

Meet the Member






Barbara Palko was born in Perrysburg, Ohio in 1941 and raised on a self-sufficient one acre plot of land. Barb was inspired by her mother who sewed all their clothes, to include Easter outfits and hats, from flour sacks and other material.

After graduating from Rossford High School in 1959, Barb continued her education at Bowling

Green State University, transferring to the Univ of Miami, FL and graduating in 1962. She landed her dream job in 1966 with NOAA as a Fisheries Biologist. She was the first woman on many research vessels, often working with Japanese and Portuguese fisherman who believed a woman on board was bad luck.

In 1981 Barb moved to Panama City on a medical transfer where she retired in 1996 after 30 yrs of service.



When Barb's arthritis made it difficult to sew, she gifted her Bernina and material to a friend in south Florida and put her sewing days behind her. However, a few years later she realized she could still sew with a push button automated machine using a wooden skewer to manipulate the buttons. She bought a Brother machine and continues to create and challenge herself. She loves to watch quilting programs for inspiration. Adding an embroidery stitch to the binding for the quilts she gifts is her favorite way to finish a quilt.

Throughout her quilting journey Barb estimates she has sold, gifted, and donated 100's of quilts. Her advice to new quilters is to be flexible and go where your brain takes you, there are no mistakes in quilting just happy circumstances. She joined SABQG in 2013 and enjoys attending the night meetings with her caregiver, who she has turned into a quilter!


