Getting to Know You - Member Corner

Edyth Brown had two requirements for a new city to call home: it had to have a quilt shop and a quilt guild she could join. She found them in Panama City. Edyth was born in Pennsylvania in 1937. In 1958 she



married and moved with her husband to St Petersburg FL, Jacksonville FL, and finally to Miami FL where she lived for 40 years. Her three children are all graduates of The University of Miami and after raising them, Edyth followed in their footsteps, attending, and graduating from The University of Miami with a BS in Nursing. She was a pediatric nurse in Miami for 12 years until her retirement. No quilting happens once UM 'Canes football season starts as Edyth, her three children, and two grandchildren are all proud 'Canes football fanatics!!

Edyth remembers her mother quilting, but she did not begin quilting herself until 1976 when she was a Girl Scout Leader and her troop sewed tote bags out of quilted squares in honor of the Bicentennial. She caught the quilting bug from this project and quickly joined a local guild in Miami. For years she shopped at a local store that had quality quilt end-of-bolt yardage for \$2.00, ensuring she had a healthy fabric stash for all her quilt making.

In 2008, after the death of her husband, Edyth moved from Miami to Panama City to be closer to her grandchildren. She immediately joined SABQG where she has served as President, Secretary, Membership Director, and most recently Bee Keeper. Quilts with one theme that are multi-dimensional with embellishments such as embroidery or paint are her favorite. Her advice to quilters is to spend their money wisely and don't sign up for a class that is above their abilities, which can lead to frustration.

Through the SABQG she has met wonderful people and is thankful that guild members ensure she has a ride to the monthly meetings since she no longer drives. Edyth cherishes the friendships she has developed and is thankful for her quilting family in Panama City.
