

## Getting to know you - Member Corner



The one thing you can count on at the SABQG night meeting is that Dolores Fowler will be there with her two daughters Ann Pyle and Bonnie Holley by her side. Dolores, the guilds oldest member, is an extremely active 95 year old who still quilts prolifically and credits her good health to staying active every day.

Dolores Fowler was born and raised in Charleston, South Carolina. After graduating from high school she was set up on a date by her parents and their friends. This 'set up' let to a wedding two weeks later, five children and a very happy marriage of 65 years until Johnnie's death in 2013.

The Fowler's moved to Panama City FL in 1957 when Johnnie, a civil servant, was offered a promotion from the Charleston shipyards to the Naval Base in Panama City Beach, FL.

Once her children were grown and husband retired from civil service Dolores decided she needed to find new activities to stay engaged. First, she and her husband embarked on a motorcycle trip around the US. Second, she joined clubs looking for hobbies. In 1986 at the age of 62 she joined SABQG and started quilting. Dolores and a Garden Club friend signed up for a guild sponsored bus trip to the Paducah Quilt Show. They had such a great time that her daughter Ann told her she wanted to go the next year, and they had such a great time that Bonnie decided she needed to go on the next Paducah road trip. The mother and daughters' love of quilting has been going strong for years and they enjoy getting together to compare squares, patterns, techniques, and laughs.

Dolores still enjoys hand

quilting but her favorite part of the quilting process is sewing on the binding and label and finishing the quilt. She's finished more than a few! Although her children grew up and moved all over the world, they have now all returned to the local area. Her 5 children, 27 grands, 10 great-grands and 2 great-great grands all have quilts lovingly made by Dolores.



Her advice to new quilters is to start small. Make a wall hanging or small quilt that you can finish and enjoy a sense of accomplishment. Increase the size and skill level at your own pace....and always stay active! We look forward to celebrating your 96th birthday in December Dolores!
