Betty's Presidents Challenge, due in May of 2023, is any block pattern you choose in a Red, White, and Blue theme or a Floral Block. Turn in a 9  $\frac{1}{2}$ " square (9"when finished). Betty also challenged us all to enter guilts in our Quilt Show happening in March. Our next Quilt Show will have a new category called Junior Quilter's Category. This will not be a judged category but for display. This is to encourage our young quilters in their pursuit of quilt making. Vice-President -Kathye DeLuca - This month is Breast Cancer Awareness month and Kathye challenged us all to take care of ourselves and get our exams. January's program will be an Ugly Quilt Contest. Basically, there will be no rules but there will be a few prizes. 2nd Vice-President - Betty Marler said that the evening group is making items for the boutique. **Secretary** - Debbie Hagen - Minutes from last general meeting were posted in last month's Patchwords. There were no questions or comments on those minutes. **Treasurer** – Karen Radcliff - We are doing well. We have a little over \$34,000 in the guild checking account. Community Service: Janet Bell and Trudy -Trudy thanked everyone that was involved in September's Workday Wednesday. It was a very productive day of sandwiching quite a few quilts. These quilts are now ready for guild members to help bind and quilt Let Trudy or Janet know if you'd like to help out in this area. We will be finishing up making our Christmas stockings at workday Wednesday on October 26th. Special **Events**: Barbara Tillman – The November General Meeting will be held on November 19th. Sign-up sheet, for side dishes, will be passed around for those attending the event. Ham/Turkey will be provided by the guild. The pie contest for that day is full. The Christmas luncheon will be catered by



Trigo. The Christmas luncheon will cost \$10 and will be held on December 10th . There will be a Kitchen hand towel exchange. This should be a wrapped item. **Education**: Marie Granger – No Report – Betty Marler mentioned that we will be having a Barn Quilt Class in January. Signups started today and the class is currently full. There maybe an opportunity for a 2nd class. Debbie Bennett announced there will be a technique's workshop on January 28th from 9:00-11:00 AM. the quilt show. Debbie Register announced we will have a snack booth at this year's quilt show. It will be called Bits & Pieces Snack Shop. Coffee, tea, water, and small snack items. Alana Y is in charge of the volunteer's lunchroom. This room is only for those who are working the quilt show. Betty Marler announced that we will have tickets available for the Quilt Show to presell. **Sunshine:** Linda Tew – 12 members received cupcakes for October birthdays. **Show and Tell:** There were approximately 15 women and about 45 quilts show today. **General Program**: VP Kathye DeLuca – Today's program was presented by Debbie Register. She spoke on our Quilt Show entry categories for quilts. Very information program. Go to our website to see a list

of categories and entry forms for the March Quilt Show. There is a new category called Block Party. The Attendees at the guilt show will vote on this category. This will not be a judged category but will be voted on by the attendees. The block that gets the most votes will receive all the blocks. These blocks will be red, white, and blue and have at least one star. One per member allowed to be entered. The blocks should be 10 ½" (finished at 10"). Debbie also showed a book called "The Little Ghost that was a Quilt", by Riel Mason. Kathye DeLuca gave out door prizes today. Gaye Ryon, Karen McQueen, and Sandy Smith, & Debbie Register received bagged gifts.Adjourn: Meeting adjourned at 11:25 am.

Seeing what others are working on, finishing a few of her projects and spending time with fellow quilters makes for a perfect weekend.

Bonnie was born and raised in Mobile, AL. Her friend and next door neighbor introduced her to their best friend, and the three became inseparable. After high school Bonnie married her neighbor's best friend and their adventure began.

Bonnie's husband became a manager for TG&Y department stores. Their first move was to Ft Walton Beach where they spent four years and then on to Mariana for 17 years. While her husband managed TG&Y Bonnie managed the home and their three daughters while also being a paid seamstress. In 1986 when TG&Y was sold, Bonnie and her husband made the decision to strike out on their own and purchased a department store and gift shop in downtown Port

St. Joe. After buying the store Bonnie was in charge of it while her husband ran the gift shop at the beach until his death in 1996.

She also enjoys the girl's trips to Paducah and Houston quilt shows as well as bus trips to shop hop.

Piecing is one of her favorite parts of quilting, and binding which she sews on by hand is her least favorite. She loves the process of choosing patterns and materials and says there is no

shortage of projects waiting for her. Bonnie's advice to new quilters is watch that 1/4 seam, it is everything in quilting!
