SABQG Christmas Cranberry Punch

- 2 Liters ginger ale (one big bottle)
- 4 cups cranberry blend juice (100% juice)

We used cranberry/raspberry

- 2 cups pineapple juice (Dole in the can)
- 2 tsp almond extract (the secret ingredient)

Fresh cranberries and lime slices for garnish

ANGEL PIE

Meringue Crust:

4 egg whites

1/4 teaspoon cream of tarter

1 cup of sugar

Beat egg whites until stiff. Add the cream of tarter then add

the sugar gradually. Pour meringue into a greased pie plate

and shape into a crust. Bake at 275 degrees for 1 hour.

Turn off oven and let set in the warm oven for as long as possible to dry.

You can also make small individual ones by shaping and baking on

parchment paper. Just don't bake them as long.

Filling:

1 thawed package of frozen raspberries

3 Tablespoons corn starch

3/4 to 1 cup sugar (to taste)

Drain berries saving the juice. Add enough water to make 1 cup of liquid.

Add corn starch and cook (stirring constantly) until thick.

Cool and add berries, add to the crust and top with cool whip, refrigerate.
