Also a class on Feb 4th, paper piecing by CAROLYN PIC, supply list at sign up was distributed. There will also be another class on Tuck and Fold, taught by, DEBBIE BENNETT, will be on Saturday, January 28th at the church from 9 to 1. BARBARA TILLMAN reported on the success of the Thanksgiving and Christmas luncheons. The next event will be the Installation of Officers in May. BETTY MARLER interjected to say that TOM PRUITT, will be the nominating committee chair for new officers. Why not visit https://www.librarycat.org/lib/SABQGLIBRARY and check it out? Looking for a particular topic, book, or author? Just type it in the search bar and see what comes up. When you find a book you want to check out, write down the number listed in the "tags" section, and either text it to me at 850-896-1625, email it to me at MLAkerlind@comcast.net, or tell me in person at any meeting, and I will be happy to check it out to you. If you prefer to browse the shelves, just let me know, and I will make it happen!

Here are just a few of the books I found by typing "Precuts" into the search bar:

#353 Bundles of Fun: Quilts From Fat Quarters, By Karen Snyder: 12 stylish ways to use your fat quarter bundles, from baby quilts to bed quilt

#270 Noodle Soup By Debbie Caffrey is a simple to follow quilting book showing you how to make dozens of quilts using 2" wide strips with fast and accurate rotary cutting techniques.

#433 Turning Twenty by Tricia Cribbs answers the question "How much fabric do I need?" 20 Fat Quarters - that's it! Make a large quilt in just a few short hours. Perfect if you are just beginning and a dream if you are an experienced quilt maker. You will find step by step instructions & color photos.

#322 Easy Cut Quilts With a Modern Twist by Laurel Albright

Seven simple quilts using a variety of pre-cut fabrics, minimal cutting and piecing perfect for quilters of all skill levels. Pillows, table toppers, place mats, quilt throws, bed runner, bed topper made in a day.

#238 Jelly Roll Quilts & More by Kimberly Einmo: Cleverly combine basic units to create quilts perfect for quilters of all skill levels that may look complex but are easy to assemble.


