- *Quilt must be clean with a label on the back. The label needs to be covered by another piece of fabric attached with safety pins, etc. Each quilt needs a pillowcase with the name & phone # of the piecer, quilter, & quilt name.
- *All quilts need a 4" sleeve. If the quilt is large, you will need to split the 4"
 wide sleeve into 2 pieces with about a ½" gap.

Also, it needs a 4" sleeve. If the quilt is large, you will need to split the 4" wide sleeve into 2 pieces with about a ½" gap. Quilt Show quilt dropoff will be Tuesday, March 14 th, 1:00 pm at Lynn Haven United Methodist Church, 3203 Minnesota Ave, Lynn Haven, FL. Betty Marler announced the Quilt Show tickets are available for pre-sale. Tickets are \$7 and the door, but only \$5 pre-sale. It is free to members that work at the Quilt Show. There will be a \$25 gift card for the member that sells the most tickets before the show. There has been \$2800 in Ads sold. Cher Adams will be creating the booklet for the Quilt Show. Looking for some paper-piecing patterns? Whether you use the traditional paper-piecing method or the freezer paper method from Carolyn Pic's wonderful class, your SABQG lending library has several choices to find patterns and ideas that don't cost you a dime! Here are some books I found by typing "Paper Piecing" into the search bar:

#127 Kaleidoscope Paper Piecing: 10 Dynamic Quilt Designs by Nancy Mahoney lets you make a dazzling kaleidoscope quilt with perfect points. Each paper-pieced quilt pattern features eight shapes that come together to form a single, wonderfully unique block.

#110 24 Blocks You Never Dreamed You Could Paper Piece edited by Linda Causee includes a variety of patterns from simple to complex, including blocks with curves by only sewing straight lines.

#168 P.S. I Love You Two! A Sequel by Lynda Milligan includes a variety of techniques including strip piecing and paper piecing.

#147 When Quilters Gather: 20 Patterns of Piecers at Play by Ruth McDowell uses paper piecing with an art quilt vibe. Includes 17 pieced block designs with variations to make a 13 block sampler or to create your own new masterpiece.

For a particular topic, book, or author type the key word in the search bar at https://www.librarycat.org/lib/SABQGLIBRARY and see what comes up. When you find a book you want to check out, write down the number listed in the "tags" section, and either text it to me at 850-896-1625, email it to me at MLAkerlind@comcast.net, or tell me in person at any meeting, and I will be happy to check it out to you.
