The judge has been hired. She can provide a Judges Tour for 20 members on Thursday evening, March 14, 2024. The tour is a mini-class that will teach those participating how quilts are judged. There's a sign-up sheet in the back, so sign up if you're interested.

<u>Gadgets</u>: Sarah Hutton provided an overview of quilting magazines that provide instruction of various techniques.

Karen Jones: Karen brought mola quilting from Panama for members to view.

<u>Sunshine and Shadows, Linda Tew</u>: We had 7 members celebrate July birthdays during this meeting.

<u>UFOs</u>: Bill Valle reviewed the UFO rules and reminded members that today is the deadline to sign up. He will be at the meetings to see your finished projects and make sure you get credit for the drawing during the annual meeting. He reviewed labeling requirements.

<u>Food Drive</u>: Jo-Ellen Rogers reminded us that we support Catholic Services food pantries with donations in October and November to help replenish their pantries. Jo Ellen parks in front with her vehicle open so you can just drop the food off.

<u>Program</u>: Diane Wishart introduced Sheila Jiminez with a summary of Sheila's 30 years of military service. Sheila presented the group with a history of patriotic quilts, followed by an overview of quilts that we donate to Sims Veterans home and to Warriors Beach Retreat.

<u>Warrior Beach Retreat</u>: We began several years ago supporting the Warrior Beach Retreat to support the caregivers of severely wounded veterans. We've provided over 250 quilts to Warrior Beach. Donna Gibbens, Linda Kelley, and Mary Molinari are the primary guild representatives. The retreat needs quilts that are no smaller than 50 X 65 but prefer twin bed size. There's a need for longer quilts for the taller recipients.

The next retreat will be November 7-13, with the awards dinner on November 9.

<u>Sims Veterans Home</u>: Glory Bee toured the facility, including the Alzheimer's wing. It is run by the Veterans Administration, and you must be a veteran to be eligible to reside there.

The veterans home was named in honor of Clifford Sims, a Port St Joe native who was a Medal of Honor recipient.

Glory Bee was started in August of 2022. The bee has 10-12 members who meet at Gaye Ryon's each Tuesday morning. They generally finish two tops per month. They've delivered 18 quilts to Sims, with one ready to be quilted and other being worked on. Sims needs quilts (64 X 75), wheelchair quilts, and longer quilts for tall people. These quilts need to be well-constructed because they get washed in the facility laundry.

The meeting was adjourned by Betty Marler at 11:38.
