#### CHRISTMAS BLOCK CHALLENGE

Make a 10 1/2" square block with white or white on white back ground. YOU decide what colors you want, any pattern depicting the holiday, due at the Christmas Luncheon 12/14.

Ribbons will be awarded! 1st, 2nd, 3rd, Honorable Mention and Best of Show!!!! (That should get you in the mood for the Quilt Show!!! (1) And here are some things you should bring. Your projects to work on and any supplies you will need: Sewing machine (with cord), thread, scissors, needles, pins, rotary cutter & mat, pencils, chalk, fabric glue, rulers. This list is endless! Bring what you think you'll need! You may want to bring some fabric scraps in case there's a mini challenge with awards.

There will be two community irons and ironing boards. You can bring a small personal iron. We've had good luck with these in the past, but there's always the possibility that we would need to limit their use.

We'll provide coffee and bottled water. Bring a snack to share if you would like.

Optional: Bring three fat quarters for a game of chance.

For the overnighters: Bring your full size bed linens and toiletries: sheets, blanket, pillows, towels, washcloths, hand soap, shampoo, etc. Laguna Beach doesn't provide these.

We're allowed to start moving into the classroom Friday morning, November 1, at 10:00 am. No earlier! Lodging rooms will become available a little later.
