#### **Community Service**

Thank you to the 13 quilters who attended last month's Workday Wednesday. We missed the quilters who went to Paducah. Tops were cut and pieced, bibs and burp pads sewn, and tops/batting/backs were prepared for quilting.

Recent Donations - Covenant House, Men's Recovery in Wewahitchka - 5 large quilts made and donated by the Thread Catchers Bee.

Year-End Report – From 6/1/24 to 5/31/25, the Guild donated over 1,100 handmade items valued at \$29,376, about 100 items were quilts. This would not be possible without participation from you, the Guild members. Thank you for all you do!

Items donated included twin quilts, lap quilts, children quilts, fidget quilts, receiving blankets, burp cloths, baby bibs, adult bibs, pillowcases, travel pillows, tote bags, walker bags, chemo scarves, NICU items (such as isolette covers, bassinet blankets, pads, crochet octopus', breast milk lovies). Also donated were holiday stockings, dog beds, food and school supplies (not included in total items or value).

Agencies who received donations – Anchorage Children's Home, Alzheimer's Alliance, Bay County Council on Aging, Beach Warrior Retreat, Blountstown American Legion, Catholic Charities, Children's Home Society, Covenant House Men's Recovery, Sim's State Veterans Nursing Home, Earthen Vessels Women's Recovery, Family Service, Fostering Love Quilts, Gulf Coast Hospital-NICU, Lynn Haven Methodist Church-Foster Closet, Hope Regional Cancer Center, Mathison Assisted Living, Pineapple Willy's Foundation for Hurricane Relief-Helene, Pregnancy Resource Center, Quilts of Valor, Dog Rescue Groups, food banks and schools.

The next Workday Wednesday will be June 25th. We will be working on cutting and sewing tops and making kits for quilters to work on at home.
