

- **St Andrew Bay Quilters' Guild**
 - **Day Meeting**
 - **August 20, 2025**

CALL TO ORDER: The meeting was called to order at 9:30 am by President Alana Yuratich. She asked members to silence their phone and stand for the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag of The United States of America.

She announced READY SET GO will be our mantra for the next 6 months to get ready for the quilt show. She thanked the members for their generous donation of school supplies. After the meeting is adjourned we will have our annual table sale.

TREASURER: Sandy Austill reported the books are balanced and bills are paid. There is a copy of the treasurers report posted on the whiteboard at the back of the room for members.

COMMUNITY SERVICE: Aly Tuttle reported Workday Wednesday was attended by 23 quilters. We organized and cut fabric kits, sewed stockings, labeled quilts, sewed bibs, cut receiving blanket kits, and matched tops to backs for quilting. Thank you to the charity quilt long-armers, Georgia D and Vickie W, and to Marsha M who binds many of the charity quilts. Thank you to the quilters who turned in quilt tops, blankets, bibs, burp pads, walker bags they made at home. The quality of everyone's work is amazing! I think we need to start showing more charity quilts during "Show N Tell". Because of your help, we were able to deliver the following donations in July: Anchorage Children's Home 1 large child quilt and 25 pillowcases, Bay Count Council on Aging 1 large twin quilt and two walker bags, Catholic Charities Infant Room 1 child quilt, 4 receiving blankets, 4 baby bibs, and 15 burp pads. Family Service Agency 12 small tote bags, 3 baby bibs, 3 fleece blankets, and 5 adult bibs. Stockings Diane Wishart has finished cutting 500 stockings Thank You! The next Workday Wednesday will be August 27th, we will be sewing stockings.

SHOW N TELL: Members shared their finished quilt projects. Aly Tuttle showed some of the items members have made for charity including walker bags, quilts and other items that members have made at workday and at home.

EDUCATION: Marie Granger discussed the upcoming pumpkin class. The Gem class has about 30 signed up. At the Sept meeting the kits will be distributed for the Gem class as there will be some homework prior to the class.

HOSPITALITY: Lois Stanek thanked the Busy Bees for refreshments. Next month non-bee members will provide refreshments.

EVENTS: Betty Marler reported she is getting ready for the Holiday Season. Nov 19 at the regular meeting we will have our Thanksgiving Luncheon. We might 19 another Turkey Contest with prizes. The night guild will have their Thanksgiving meal at the night meeting. In November there will be a voluntary Love Donation to the Church. There will be a vase on the table by the whiteboard for donations. The Pastor will be invited to the Dec. Meeting for presentation of the Check. The Guild will try to match the donation. December 13 will be the joint Christmas meeting. There will be no night meeting in December.
