4. Have a list of included items and approximate container value.




Tickets this year will be \$1.00 each.

Community Service

Thank you to the 20 quilters who attended Workday Wednesday in October. Adult bibs were sewn, 9 tops matched with backs and batting, and boxes of donations from others were sorted.

Thank you to everyone for your help with stockings and other items you made at home and donated. Because of you all, we were able to deliver donations to the following charities:

- Council on Aging - Throw quilts, walker bags, and tote bags. Children's Home Society - Child quilts, receiving blankets, baby bibs, and burp pads. Catholic Charities Infant Room - Child quilts, receiving blankets, baby bibs, burp pads, and 40 stockings. Family Service Agency - Fleece blankets, adult bibs, baby bibs, and 80 stockings. Sims Veteran's Nursing Home - Large quilts, throw quilts, adult holiday bibs, and 40 stockings. Pregnancy Resource Center - 10 baby receiving blankets made and delivered by Linda T. Catholic Charities Food Bank - Food valued at \$850 in September and October. 7 large patriotic quilts to Warrior Beach Retreat. Thank you everyone for making this possible!

Update on Council on Aging Fall Fest - Thank you to the Busy Bees group for donating the sewing basket to the silent auction; and thank you to all the Busy Bee volunteers who helped with the auction on Friday and Saturday. There were 75 items to bid on. Our basket sold for \$100. Mary Molinari's donated quilt sold for \$250. The silent auction made over \$3,000. The fall fest made about \$52,000. Each \$ is matched 9 to 1 in grant funds.
